# 2018 NC Junior Angus Association State Show

## GENERAL RULES

### I. ELIGIBILITY OF EXHIBITORS & ENTRIES

1. Exhibitor must be born on or after January 1, 1997. There is no minimum age but the exhibitor must be able to control his/her animal in the ring without any help to show in the breed shows.
2. Exhibitor must be a Junior Member of the NC Junior Angus Association.
3. Entries must be submitted online, postmarked, or emailed on or before the entry deadline.
4. Entries must be registered with the American Angus Association and be accompanied with the correct tattoos and registration papers.
5. Only NC residents are eligible to show in the NCJAA State Show.

### II. FITTING & SHOWING GUIDELINES

1. Each entry must be shown by its owner or by its pre-registered exhibitor.
2. If a junior member can't show his/her own heifer due to multiple entries in his/her respective class or division, another NCJAA exhibitor is allowed to show the additional entry.
3. Only one person will be allowed to lead each entry in the show ring.
4. Any exhibitor who loses control of his/her entry more than twice in the show ring will be asked to remove the animal from the ring.
5. All entries must be on time for their respective class. Once the entries in the exhibitor's respective class have begun walking into the profile view, the exhibitor is too late and ineligible to compete.
6. Bulls 12 months of age or older must be shown with a nose lead.
7. All entries are subject to Rule 800: Show Rules of the American Angus Association rules. Rule 800 includes identification of animals; confirmation and structure; alteration of conformation and structure; exhibitor conduct as well as other rules pertaining to the exhibition of Angus cattle.
8. Each exhibitor is responsible for having his/her animal presented in its best state, while still adhering to the National Junior Angus Association show rules.
9. Junior Angus exhibitors are required to wear tucked-in, collared shirts while in the show ring.
10. The use of products in aerosol cans in preparing an animal for the show ring will not be permitted once the animal enters the line-up area for the show, and will result in the dismissal of animal from the show.
11. Coloring agents of any kind are not allowed.
12. This is a **NO fit show**. Animals that are fit with adhesives will be disqualified.

### III. MISCELLANEOUS

1. All animals must meet the health requirements for the exhibition purposes as required by the North Carolina Department of Agriculture.
2. All animals must be checked by the designated veterinarian or NCJAA representative before they are brought into the barn.
3. No dogs are allowed on the show grounds.

#### **IV. AGREEMENT OF RESPONSIBILITY & LIABILITY**

1. It is clearly understood and agreed that the North Carolina Junior Angus Association and its officials, officers, directors, and members (hereinafter collectively referred to as “the Association”) shall not be responsible for the damage, loss or injury to any person or property which is caused directly or indirectly for any reason. The exhibitor, owner, their agents and/or representatives, (hereinafter collectively referred to as “Participants”), agree to indemnify and hold the Association harmless for any damage, injury or loss suffered during or in connection with the NCJAA State Show (hereinafter collectively referred to as “the Show”). In the event the Association is subject to any expense or liability, including, but not limited to consultant fees, legal or court costs, the Association management labor and expenses, expenses and/or costs for blood, tissue, urine, hide and/or carcass sampling and testing incurred as a result of the Association’s rules and regulations violations and all agreements there under, including, but not limited to unethical fitting, filling, meat tampering, illegal or non-approved use of drugs, medication and/or prohibited substance(s) as a result of the participants involvement in the Show, participant shall indemnify and hold harmless the Association for all damage, expenses or liabilities incurred as a result of thereof. Participant may also be subject to criminal charges.
2. The participant will have full control, custody, care and feeding of any animal(s) and/or personal property, which are brought on or about the premises of the site of the Show.
3. It is clearly understood and agreed between the parties that, as a material condition to any participant entering or showing at the Show. The Association will at no time have control, custody or care of any animal(s) and/or personal property, which are brought on or about the Show site.
4. For the overall working of the show, the participant will maintain control, custody, care and feeding of any and all animals and/or personal property in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Show, and in no way will the Association be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur or be caused by any animal or personal property.
5. By submitting an application or entry, participants agree to comply with all the rules and regulations governing the Show and the Association. Further, these provisions include total ownership of the entry for the prescribed number of days, continuous procession and care and provisions against unethical fitting, and/or alteration of conformation and color or animal(s), meat tampering and illegal or non-approved use of drugs, medication and/or prohibited substance.

#### **V. SHOW CATEGORIES**

1. There will be classes for cow-calf pairs, steers, bulls, and heifers. Champions will be selected in each category. In the heifer category there will be an owned and bred-and-owned Grand and Reserve Champion.
2. Show classifications for heifers: April 1, 2016 through December 31, 2017.
3. Show classifications for bulls: January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2017.
4. Show classifications for steers: January 1, 2017 through December 31, 2017.
5. Cow/Calf: Calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and be no more than 280 days of age on the day of the Show (July 22, 2017).
6. Showmanship will be a traditional format with the following age divisions:  
**Senior, Intermediate, Junior, Novice, and Pee-Wee.**
