Sale Requirements

Consignment deadline - April 1, 2022

Eligibility

- Animals must have one registered Angus Parent (sire or dam).
 - consignor must confirm 50% Angus on the female and the service sire should be a registered Angus bull
- Consignments may include: bred cows, bred heifers & open heifers
- For bred females registration numbers of service sires must be provided.
- Actual birth dates or month/year of birth must be provided for all females
- Females must be 5 years old or younger as of sale date
- Bred females must be due to calve September 1 through December 31, 2022
- Females designated as open on sale date will not sell, unless they are classified as an open heifer
- Females must be a body condition score of 6 and at least a medium frame as designated by USDA Livestock Marketing Guidelines
- BQA Certification is recommended
- Consignors must be a member of NC Angus Association. If not currently a member, dues can be paid along with consignments.
- Females are required to have an USDA 840 tag. 840 tags are USDA approved tags for official individual animal identification. (840 tags may be supplied by the NCAA.)

Health

- Females must be vaccinated for IBR, BVD, PI 3, BRSV, leptospirosis (5-way), vibriosis, and 7-way clostridia (consignors choice of modified-live or killed vaccines). Consignors must submit a written copy of vaccination records.
- All females must be BVD-PI tested negative through ear notch or blood test
- Pregnancy checks should be conducted by an accredited veterinarian through palpation or ultrasound within 30 days of the sale.
- Females should be treated for internal and external parasites and vaccination boosters should be given within 30 days of sale.

Pre-Breeding

- Virgin females (first calf heifers) must have a repro tract score (RTS) from an accredited veterinarian including pelvic measurement. Heifers must pass RTS.

Sale Preparation

- Consignors are encouraged to submit high quality photos and videos of their consignments to the NC Angus office by May 1, 2022 for use in promoting their cattle and the sale.

- All cattle should be delivered to the George P. Upton Sale Arena by **3:00 pm on Thursday, June 2**. George P. Upton Sale Arena address: 93 Agriculture Way – Clinton, NC 28328

Consignment Information

- Non-refundable consignment fees and forms are due to the NC Angus Association by April 1, 2022. Consignment fees are forfeited if the female does not make it to the sale.
 - Fee structure is as follows:
 - 1-5 head = \$25/head
 - 6-15 head = \$20/head
 - 15 head or more = \$15/head
- Substitution lots are allowed but must meet all entry, health and sale requirements. The number of substitution lots cannot exceed the original number of entries from the consignor. All substitution must be submitted to the NCAA no later than one week prior to the sale date.
- A 5% sale commission will be charged per lot to cover all sale expenses (i.e.: facility, auctioneer, advertising, catalogs, etc.). If your animal goes through the ring and you do not sell her, you will be charged a sale commission.
- The sale committee will conduct screenings of all consigned cattle before the sale. The sale committee also reserve the right to refuse any female that does not meet the sale criteria or is deemed to have any unsatisfactory characteristics including but not limited to a wild disposition, poor body condition, bad feet and leg structure, etc.
- There are no limits to the number of head that may be consigned. However, the final number of consignments allowed will be at the discretion of the Sale Committee. The Sale Committee will select females for the sale based on the following criteria:
 - Females that are AI sired or AI bred
 - 3-5 year old cows
 - bred heifers
 - open heifers
- Consignors may establish a reserve (floor) on their consignments. This will be handled directly between the consignor and the auctioneer.

Sale Term

- All sale day proceeds will be collected and distributed to the consignors by the North Carolina Angus Association.
- Cattle will sell under the Terms and Conditions of the American Angus Association, view the full document at https://angus.org/Pub/suggested_sale_terms.pdf?v=1
